COUNCIL ACTIONS

June 5, 1979

A reorganizational meeting of the Council was held at the Society office on Tuesday evening, June 5, 1979. Dr. Robert J. Lorello, President, called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Those present were Drs: Robert J. Lorello, Joel S. Cherashore, Bernard Robins, James J. O'Grady, George L. Benz, Daniel N. Burbank and John R. Tobey, Officers; Drs: Peter Amirata, Jr., Cono A. Pecora and Eugene R. Sims, Councilors; Drs: Alton E. Bythewood, Arthur Bernstein, William Greifinger, S. William Kalb, Charles I. Nadel, Frank Y. Watson, and John Winslow, Past-Presidents.

RENEW LEASE

Dr. Charles I. Nadel was requested to Chair a committee composed of Drs: Daniel N. Burbank, Robert J. Lorello and Frank Y. Watson, to negotiate a lease renewal for the Essex County Medical Society office, since the present lease expires on December 31, 1979.

COMMITTEE APPOINTMENTS

Dr. Robert J. Lorello announced the appointment of two Committees. The Nominating Committee will consist of Peter Amirata, Jr., M.D., Chairman and Drs: James M. Brown, William J. Ranucci, Pablo P. Roy, and Frank Y. Watson, Committee members. The Judicial Committee consists of Frank Y. Watson, M.D., Chairman and Joel S. Cherashore, M.D., Vice-Chairman and Drs: Peter Amirata, Jr., Alton E. Bythewood, Enio J. Calluori, William M. Chase, Alfred R. Dardis, Humbert M. Gambacorta, Robert J. Lorello, Geraldine S. Meanor, Bernard Robins, L. Arne Skilbred, William I. Weiss and Florence M. McGill.

MIENJ ASSISTS YOUNG MEMBERS

A memorandum was received from the Medical Inter-Insurance Exchange of New Jersey announcing a revised rating approach for some new physicians. A 50% premium saving will be realized for the first 18 months' practice for new Solos. Effective May 1, 1979, they will consider anyone entering private practice on this basis to be less than full-time for a year and one-half. The part-time rating classification will allow for a full 50% reduction in premium. This initial cost reduction should make our program more attractive to those who would like to join MIENJ but are prevented from doing so initially due to the overwhelming financial burden of starting an independent practice.

DRUG ABUSE EDUCATION

Dr. Lorello announced that Eugene R. Sims, M.D., a member of our Council, has been appointed to the Essex County Task Force for Drug Abuse Education in The School/Community. Dr. Sims has stated that he will have a report of its activities for presentation to our Council in the Fall.

STUDENT AMA

A letter was received from Paul H. Lipkin, President of the American Medical Student Association, thanking us for financial support to assist their delegates in attending the American Medical Student Association in Denver.

A letter was received from Roger Thompson, President of the MSNJ Student Association at CMDNJ-New Jersey Medical School, thanking us for our financial support in sending students to the State Society Annual Convention, May 12-15, 1979, in Atlantic City.

OSTEOPATHIC ASSOCIATION

A letter was received from Frank F. Zaccardi, D.O., President of the Essex County Association of Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons, commenting favorably on the cordial relationship between the M.D.'s and D.O.'s in this area during the past eight years.

He stated that he was proud and pleased that this cooperative relationship exists in working together in such organizations as our PSRO and our IPA. The Council decided to thank Dr. Zaccardi for his letter.

INTERNATIONAL KLAFTER INSURANCE AGENCY

Dr. Charles I. Nadel, Chairman of our Insurance Committee, reported that:

- 1 - On October 19, 1976 this Council approved the ECMS sponsoring a disability group coverage submitted by Mr. Leonard Klafter of International Underwriters of New York. The policy was the Continental Casualty Company with "no age limit if in practice".

The premium remained the same for 1976, 1977 and 1978. However, this year it was increased by 50% with the concurrence of the New Jersey Department of Insurance, and I notified the membership of this in the May 1979 Bulletin.

- 2 - On Tuesday, April 17, 1979, Dr. Nadel met with Mr. Leonard Klafter and Mr. William Wladherr of International Underwriters and they informed me of their desire to sell another disability group coverage to our members to supplement their no age limit policy. This policy would be for a cheaper premium but would have usual age limit cutoffs for those of our members who desire a cheaper, more competitive premium.
- They also brought up the fact that they have already installed a group policy for the Bergen County Medical Society on Sentry's Group Excess Major Medical coverage and desire to know whether or not our Society would be interested in such a group.

Following discussion, the Council decided that it would like a more detailed report on the proposed coverages and to have representatives of the Klafter agency present at a Council meeting in the Fall.

FILL COUNCIL INTERIM TERM

A letter was received from Thomas M. Gocke, a recently elected ECMS Councilor, informing us that he must resign from the Council because he intends to move to Florida. Dr. Lorello informed the Council that our Constitution calls for such vacancy to be filled by the Council until the next Annual Meeting. Dr. Lorello opened the floor for nominations and Carolyn W. Watson, M.D. was nominated. The nomination was seconded and it was moved, seconded and carried that nominations be closed. Dr. Watson was unanimously elected to fill the unexpired term of Dr. Gocke, until the next ECMS Annual Meeting.

REPLACE CHP TRUSTEE

Dr. Benjamin H. Safirstein recently resigned his position as Trustee of Crossroads Health Plan, and this created an opening for our ECMS Council to fill with the consultation of ECHO. Dr. Bernard Robins, President of ECHO nominated Sheldon S. Schoen, M.D. for this position. The nomination was seconded, and it was moved, seconded and carried that nominations be closed. Dr. Schoen was unanimously elected for this position.

VOLUNTARY AMA MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

Since our membership poll reflected that a vast majority of our members desire AMA membership to be on a voluntary basis, and since 70% of our members pay AMA dues voluntarily, it was decided to embark on a membership drive to increase our AMA membership as well as increase the general membership of our association. Mr. Ellenberger reported that he has been working with the AMA on this and they have offered to pay the postage for mailing to those who belong to the county and state society, but not the AMA. Dr. Frank Y. Watson volunteered to Chair a Membership Committee that would look into all avenues of increasing our membership and coordinate this with a State Society Committee which has similar aims.

GAS RATIONING

Dr. Lorello called the Council's attention to a Resolution which Dr. Benz submitted to the Medical Society of New Jersey which was adopted by their House of Delegates on May 14, 1979. This Resolution resolved that the Medical Society of New Jersey go on record that physicians, nurses and other health professionals be allocated sufficient gasoline to adequately take care of patient needs and that the Medical Society of New Jersey contact all departments of government at the state level that are concerned with fuel energy rationing to effectuate these aims.

Dr. Lorello was requested to set up an ECMS Committee to assist with any gasoline rationing plans which may evolve.

DOCTORS ON CALL

A letter was received from Mr. David L. Hitzig, President of Doctors on Call, a Brooklyn based Emergency House Call Service. Mr. Hitzig runs the largest House Call Service in the world handling over 50,000 house calls a year, and his New York operation is approved directly by the Medical Societies of the Bronx, Brooklyn, Queens and Manhattan. Mr. Hitzig would like, with our cooperation, to set-up a New Jersey Medical Emergency Service covering both Essex and Bergen Counties on a 24 hour 7 day week basis.

Following discussion, the Council decided that they would like more information on how emergency calls would be handled and requested Dr. Lorello to establish a committee which would meet with Mr. Hitzig. Members from the Council who volunteered to serve on such committee were Drs: Peter Amirata, Jr., John Winslow and Robert J. Lorello.

**18A:35-3. Course in civics, geography and history of New Jersey.** Each board of education shall adopt a course of study in community civics, the geography, history and civics of New Jersey, and the privileges and responsibilities of citizenship as they relate to community and national welfare, which course shall be taken by all pupils in the public elementary schools in the grade or grades in which it is given, with the object of producing the highest type of patriotic citizenship.

Source: C. 18:14-83.1 (1954, c. 81, s. 6).

**18A:35-4. Course in nature and effect of alcoholic drinks and narcotics.** The nature of alcoholic drinks and narcotics and their effects upon the human system shall be taught in all schools supported wholly or in part by public moneys in such manner as may be adapted to the age and understanding of the pupils and shall be emphasized in appropriate places of the curriculum sufficiently for a full and adequate treatment of the subject.

**18A:35-4. . Course of study in principles of humanity.** Each board of education may teach, by special courses or by emphasis in appropriate places of the curriculum, in a manner adapted to the ages and capabilities of the pupils in the several grades and departments, the principles of humanity as the same apply to kindness and avoidance of cruelty to animals and birds, both wild and domesticated.

#### Article 2. Physical and Military Training Courses.

**18A:35-5. Maintenance of physical training courses; features.** Each board of education shall conduct as a part of the instruction in the public schools courses in health, safety and physical education, which courses shall be adapted to the ages and capabilities of the pupils in the several grades and departments. To promote the aims of these courses any additional requirements or rules as to medical inspection of school children may be imposed.

**18A:35-6. Supervision of instruction.** Such courses, and the instruction therein, shall be subject to the general supervision and direction of the commissioner, who shall appoint, with the approval of the state board, such expert assistants as in the opinion of the state board shall from time to time be necessary to carry out the purposes of such courses.

**18A:35-7. Course required.** Every pupil, except kindergarten pupils, attending the public schools, insofar as he is physically fit and capable of doing so, as determined by the medical inspector, shall take such courses, which shall be a part of the curriculum prescribed for the several grades, and the conduct and attainment of the pupils shall be marked as in other courses or subjects, and the standing of the pupil in connection therewith shall form a part of the requirements for promotion or graduation.

TO: County Superintendents DATE May 9, 1979FROM: William Brooks *WB*SUBJECT: Commissioner's Meeting with N.J. Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges. March 22, 1979

The extract from the meeting minutes below as forwarded to advise you of this relationship and for guidance as you work with county programs in School Violence and Vandalism.

"His (Fred Burke's) talk and colloquy with our membership gave birth to one of the most vital meetings we have ever had. Whatever criticism may be aimed at this man in other corners, he does have the admiration of our group for the manner in which he has addressed himself to this problem of violence and vandalism in our schools. No doubt a majority of judges in our juvenile system are acquainted with the fact that our present laws cannot cope with misbehavior in the schools; nor for that matter with truancy. It is either an impotent probation or an introduction to the penal system and a broadening of the knowledge of becoming a criminal. It is hoped that an awareness of our meeting (illustrating the full cooperation of the Commissioner of Education with our State Council) could be brought to the attention of our Legislature and our Chief Executive. Maybe the acceptance of the invitation of Mr. Burke to attend sessions with the County Superintendents will prove to be a step in that direction. In any case, it would be tragic to lose the liaison with this energetic man whose hopes and ideals run concurrent with our own."

You may wish to follow up this with county judges, when appropriate.
