ECMS EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE COMMITTEE

SPECIAL REPORT

On July 16, 1979, Mr. David L. Hitzig, President of Doctors on Call met with Drs: Emanuel Liccese, Robert J. Lorello, Peter Amirata, Daniel Burbank and John Winslow, to answer questions on how his service would operate if established in Essex. Mr. Hitzig reported that he has been successfully operating Doctors on Call services to make physician home calls in Manhattan, Brooklyn, the Bronx and Queens. He is considering starting up services in Bergen County and Essex County and desires our sponsorship. It was determined that he charges \$35.00 or \$40.00 per call in various areas he services and that cash is requested at such calls. He claimed to have a good relationship with all of the Medical Societies in the areas he presently services and he stated he would work with us or a committee that we designate.

The Committee requested that we write to each county medical society that he named and ask them a series of five questions posed by the committee. The committee also requested that a telephone survey of all local exchanges be made to determine if there was a need for his service in our area.

The Council, at its September 18th meeting was apprised of Mr. Hitzig's desires and the Council requested that our committee again meet, study the responses and make a recommendation at our November 16th Council meeting.

The Committee met on Thursday, October 4, 1979. Drs: Emanuel Liccese, Robert Lorello, Peter Amirata, John W. Norris and John Winslow were present.

The Committee read all of the replies received from County Medical Societies and reviewed the regulations these medical societies promulgated to "Doctors on Call." The Committee also reviewed the telephone poll of our local exchanges.

Following discussion, it was moved, seconded and carried that we find that there is no demonstrated need for such a service in Essex County and we recommend to the Council that we do not endorse "Doctors on Call."

It was then moved, seconded and carried that, if Mr. Hitzig decides to proceed and set up this business in Essex County, our Emergency Medical Service Committee draft a series of strict guidelines for operation along the lines of guidelines promulgated by the New York Medical Societies. \

The Committee decided to contact some local First Aid Squads to determine if we could be of service to them by supplying speakers or educational courses for their personnel.

Dear Senator Bedell:

We understand the Bill A 1119 is presently before your Committee on Labor, Industry and Professions and that this Committee has recently tabled this matter.

This bill was considered by the Medical Society of New Jersey and was disapproved because this bill represents unnecessary legislation.

The Council of the Essex County Medical Society reviewed the bill closely and concluded that it is a poor piece of legislation inasmuch as present regulation under the State Board of Medical Examiners, on which Chiropractic is represented, is adequate.

We feel the bill would unduly extend the scope of activity of Chiropractors to include procedures now limited to fully licensed physicians and surgeons.

A 1119 would create another board to duplicate functions now adequately handled by the State Board of Medical Examiners. A new bureau, expensive to the State and its citizen taxpayers, would be established.



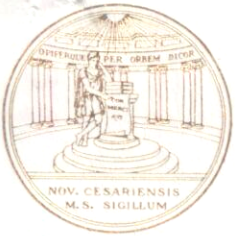
